The island of Korčula halfway between Dubrovnik and Split, is full of medieval charm and history.

The capital of the island also called, Korcula, has a deep connection to its Venetian roots. It became one of the most important ports of the Adriatic for Venice during the Middle Ages. The Venetians left many footprints throughout the city. Among these, is the Cathedral of St. Markus, complete with a painting by Tintoretto. The connection with Venice goes deeper with the claim by the locals that the merchant/ explorer/ author Marco Polo was not born in Venice, but on the island of Korcula. It even preserves the alleged home of the renowned traveler and a museum that follows the author's footsteps through his incredible life.

There are other museums and palaces to visit in Korcula, including the Museum of the City of Korcula, located in the Renaissance Gabrielli's Palace. Among its collection you can find archaeological pieces from the Greek and Roman eras that show that ancient settlers were already seduced by the charm of this island.
